Dear Friends,

One of the things I like to do is to watch movies – particularly old movies. In a bookshop I always end up thumbing through the biographies of old actors and looking at still photographs from their movies. One thing that I find intriguing is the way actors create a whole identity for themselves and their public. They create identities out of thin air. Frances Gum transfigured herself and her image into Judy Garland. Norma Jean became Marilyn Monroe. Archibald Leach became Cary Grant. And what about Marion Morrison? Would you have paid to see him in the movies? Well you did - he became John Wayne.

These people, for good or bad, went through a process of change. In the Bible many people got new names to go with a new life and a new image. Abram became Abraham. Sarai became Sarah. Jacob became Israel. Saul became Paul. Simon became Peter. Change is one thing that today's gospel is about. On the mountaintop Jesus is transfigured, changed in appearance. In the Greek the word is metamorphosis. The change Jesus undergoes is founded in his faithful and abiding relationship with God. The light and glory he bestows is the light and glory of God.

In what ways have you changed in your life? In what ways have you stayed the same?

How has your living been transformed through your connection to and relationship with God?

What is God saying to you through this process?
